
Students by major in the academic year 2019/2020


Number of students and graduates of universities in Małopolska

- **27 higher education institutions**, including the Jagiellonian University (the oldest university in Poland, founded in 1364), Cracow University of Economics, AGH University of Science and Technology, Cracow University of Technology and Pedagogical University of Cracow.
- Nearly **147 000 students** and **36 500 graduates**.
- **Financial outlays on R&D** rank the region as the **1st in the country**.
- **45 innovation and entrepreneurship support centres** – 5th place in the country.

- **Kraków** was listed as one of the **9** most attractive cities in the world and ranked first among European agglomerations for investments in the BPO&SSC sector – **TOP 100 Outsourcing Destinations Ranking**.
- In the **Tholons Global Innovation Index 2021** ranking, Kraków strengthened its position in the **TOP 100 Super Cities**, being ranked **20th**.

- Thanks to the high qualifications of employees and relatively competitive salaries, Kraków gives foreign companies a huge potential to quickly expand IT teams.
- **The largest conference in this part of Europe** devoted to the video game industry, **Digital Dragons**, is organized in Kraków and is visited by nearly 2 000 people every year.
- **The business service centers operating in Małopolska** – ComArch, Cisco, Google, Shell, Capgemini, UBS, HSBC, Saber, Luxoft, Electrolux, Philip Morris International, Hitachi Data Systems, IBM BTO, State Street, Lufthansa Global Business Services and Delphi.

Chemistry



The chemical industry is an important economy branch in Małopolska – over **2 300** entities operating in the chemical industry.



14 research units associated with chemistry, for example Cracow University of Technology, Jagiellonian University, University of Agriculture, AGH University of Science and Technology, as well as the Oil and Gas Institute.



Among the business environment institutions offering services directly for the entities involved in the field of chemistry, we may list the **Tarnów Industrial Cluster** and the **Polish Association of the Oil and Gas Industry Engineers and Technicians, Jerzy Haber Institute of Catalysis and Surface Chemistry Polish Academy of Sciences**.



Manufacturing of metals and metal products

The industry has a **major impact on the export of Małopolska** – precious metals, common metals as well as their products belong to the most important export commodities.

The share of export of Małopolska in the sector of common metals and their products is **18,1%**.

Over **2 300** business entities operating in the industry, including: Alumetal S.A., Tele-Fonika Kable S.A., Grupa Kęty S.A., Stalprodukt S.A., Grupa Polska Stal S.A. and ArcelorMittal Poland S.A.

8 scientific and research centres associated with the production of metals and metal products and the manufacture of non-metallic mineral products, including Polish Foundrymen's Association, INNOAGH, INTECH PK, AGH University of Science and Technology and Cracow University of Technology.





Investment attractiveness

- For years, Małopolska has placed itself on the top of the national rankings evaluating the investment attractiveness of a given area.
 - Direct foreign investments implemented in the region in the years 1989–2016 exceeded USD 23.2 billion. In 2017, foreign investment reached the value of USD 1,343.3 million.
 - Kraków ranks 20th in the prestigious Tholons Services Globalization City Index 2021 for the most attractive city in the world for international business services.
- Małopolska is a unique region in Poland in terms of the diversity of mineral deposits, which include: crude oil, natural gas, sulfur, gypsum, zinc, lead, sandstones, limestones, hard coal, rock salt, mineral and geothermal waters.
- The favorable location of Małopolska makes it a region with great warehouse potential. There are 17 warehouse parks in Kraków and its vicinity. The total warehouse space in Małopolska is 560,000 m².

- Kraków ranks 2nd in the Forbes ranking in the „Business-Friendly City” category.
- Kraków is ranked 2nd after Warsaw – the capital of Poland – as the largest office market in the country – the total area of modern office space in Kraków reaches 1.5 million m².
 - In 2020, Kraków once again was recognized as one of the most technologically advanced „cities of the future”. The international ranking „Top 25 Tech Cities of the Future 2020/2021” was prepared by the prestigious fDi Magazine.
 - 70 investment offers in the Business in Małopolska Centre database.
 - Every year, the number of new entrepreneurs in the voivodeship grows by around 10,000. Among them, we can find dynamically developing technology start-ups. Global corporations have invested in Małopolska, e.g. Google, Cisco, Motorola, Shell, Rolls Royce, Philip Morris, Lufthansa, Delphi, R.R. Donnelley, Coca-Cola, Heineken, MAN Trucks.

Polish Investment Zone

The Polish Investment Zone (PIZ) is a government support program that allows companies undertaking new investments to obtain tax exemptions. Kraków Technology Park is the operator of the PIZ program in the Lesser Poland Voivodeship and the Jędrzejowski Powiat (Świętokrzyskie Voivodeship). Aid can be obtained regardless of the form of business activity, the size of the company, and the country of origin of the capital. Eligible entrepreneurs are the ones who want to:

- create a new plant
- increase the production capacity of their plant
- introduce new products
- change the production process

Economic Activity Zones are separate and comprehensively prepared areas for investments, that meet the needs of potential investors, usually created by local governments.

The benefits of investing in The Economic Activity Zones:

- well-prepared investment sites with complete and modern infrastructure making it possible to start
- a business according to the relevant development plan
- separated parcels of land with the area optimized for the purpose of construction of industrial plants
- support of local councils in the implementation of investments (appointed careers, investor support teams)
- state aid in the form of exemption from property tax

High quality of life

Małopolska is one of the most interesting regions in Poland which offers a wide range of cultural and tourist attractions.

Kraków is one of the famous historical cities, visited annually by over 14 M visitors, and this number is growing every year.

Małopolska is the region with the largest number of monuments in Poland, the birthplace of Polish culture and cherished traditions.

The cultural life of the region takes place among many ancient monasteries, churches, museums, manor complexes, palaces, gardens, towns with characteristic buildings and monuments of folk art.

More than a half of the Małopolska area has been recognised as nature protection area – **6 national parks, 11 landscape parks, 10 protected landscape areas and 86 nature reserves**. Two areas – **Babia Góra and Tatra National Park** – are **UNESCO biosphere reserves** – these are unique places in the world, with unique natural beauty.

14 historical sites of Małopolska have been inscribed on the **UNESCO World Heritage List**.

Małopolska is also a mountainous region: **Tatra Mountains** with the capital in **Zakopane**, **Gorce Mountains**, **Beskidy Mountains** and limestone mountain range of **Pieniny** with their main tourist attraction – **rafting on the Dunajec River**.

Business in Małopolska Centre

In order to harmonize the activities in the field of economic promotion and standardization of services for investors and support for enterprises in Małopolska in export in 2009, the **Business in Małopolska Centre** has been established.

Partner institutions operating within the scope of this unique in the country initiative: the Małopolska Region, Małopolska Agency of Regional Development and Kraków Technology Park Ltd. carry out the tasks aimed at attracting new foreign investment and supporting the expansion of Małopolska enterprises to foreign markets.

The most important tasks of Business in Małopolska Centre include:

- maintaining database of investment offers in Małopolska
- development of investment offers,
- enabling contact between Małopolska and foreign companies

- development and distribution of information on the region's economy
- international promotion of the economic potential of Małopolska
- territorial marketing
- cooperation with local government units, business support institutions and the scientific, sector for the economic development of Małopolska
- promotion of innovative investments

Business in Małopolska Centre also prepares current analyses of regional labour market, real estate market, BPO and modern technologies sector, as well as research and development industry. The Centre is the regional partner of Polish Information and Foreign Investment Agency, using international network of institutional contacts and business partners.
